time on June 23rd

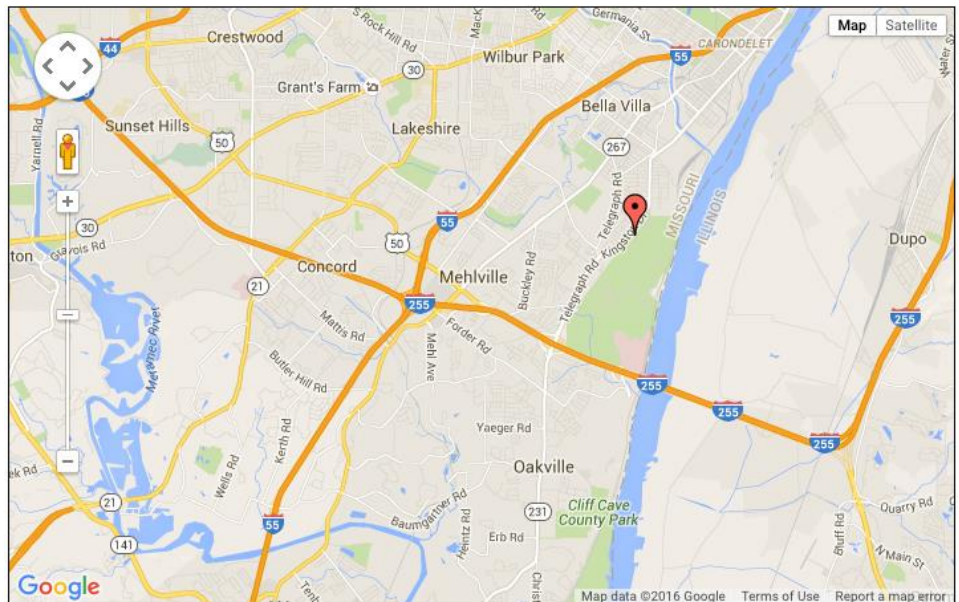
